Member Convenors and their representatives from 27 districts participated in the Orientation-cum-review meeting and various points were discussed for strengthening the activities of the Eco-clubs.

The Nodal Officer of CES appraised about the major NGC activities carried out by the Nodal agency in the State Head Quarters as well as in the District Level.

Following suggestions envisaged:

1. Participation in eco clubs activities should earn special marks for students which would be useful for the students for getting admission to Higher Education and

would ultimately help them for better prospects. This would provide good motivation to students for participation in the eco club activities.

2. DIMC needs to be more active. For this, Quarterly meetings should be arranged at

the District headquarters under the chairmanship of District Collector and all DIMC

members should participate in the meeting to review the progress of the NGC

activities and redress the problems.

3. DFOs (Member Convenors) expressed that they are unable to get the suitable co-

operation from the Education Deptt. authorities to implement the NGC Scheme. This

issue needs to be discussed in DIMC meeting.

4. Reasonable remuneration needs to be provided for Master trainers. This should be

examined.

5. CES may write to the District Collectors who are the Chairpersons of the District

Committee for stepping up monitoring eco club activities.

6. Pending utilization certificates and reports should be submitted without any

further delay. In future, timely submission should be ensured for smooth release of

grant.

7. It is seen that in many districts major part of grant remains unspent and it is being

carried forward to subsequent years. Timely utilization of grant needs to be ensured

by DIMC.

The meeting ended with vote of thanks to the dignitaries and other participants.
